Did you know? It is illegal to dispose of fluorescent bulbs in household garbage within Minnesota.

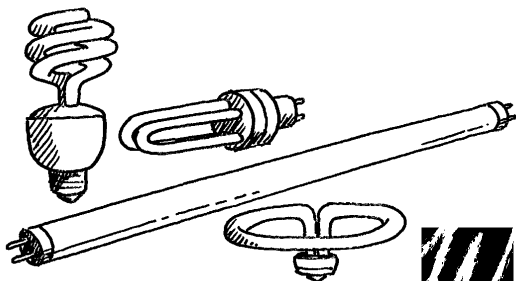
Fluorescent Tubes and Compact Bulbs

are a good idea for your home because they help conserve electricity.

However, all fluorescent bulbs contain a small amount of MERCURY. This potential pollutant is necessary for the bulbs to work and is safely contained inside during use.

- 1. When fluorescent bulbs burn out,** they cannot be thrown away. Bring bulbs to WLSSD's Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Facility for free recycling.
- 2. Transport bulbs carefully.** If bulbs break, ventilate the area, then sweep (not vacuum) pieces into a sealed bag. Bring pieces to HHW.

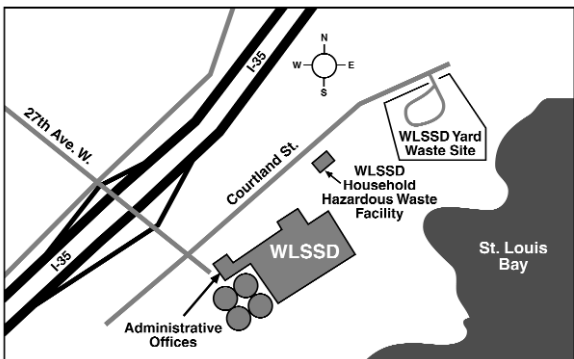
The Western Lake Superior Sanitary District (WLSSD) provides free recycling for residential fluorescent bulbs at its Household Hazardous Waste Facility at 27th Avenue West and Courtland Street, Duluth, MN. You may drop off household bulbs and tubes during open hours. Businesses should ask about WLSSD's Clean Shop Program.
