Plastics -



PET or PETE. Commonly used for pop, water, and sports drink bottles.



HDPE. Commonly used for milk and water jugs. Also used for detergent and shampoo bottles.



PVC or Vinyl. Used for clear food and non-food packaging.



LDPE. Used for squeezable bottles like honey and mustard.



PP. Used for many common household containers like catsup, yogurt, margarine, and medicine bottles.



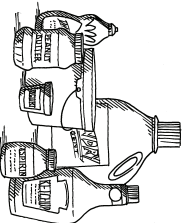
P5. Some yogurt containers and medicine bottles.



Other. Used for reusable bottles and some juice and condiment containers.

Quick Tips for Recycling Plastic



Check the bottom of your container to make sure it is recyclable.



Rinse containers to ensure a higher quality product.



No Film or Foam. This includes an styrofoam, plastics bags, or wrap.



No plastic cups, plates, or untesils.



No flower pots.



No buckets 5 gallons or larger.



No automotive containers including motor oil, antifreeze, and solvents.

Where to Recycle

Plastics #1-#7 are being accepted at all WLSSD recycling sheds. See our website for shed hours and locations (www.wlssd.com).

Most waste haulers are also collecting plastics #1-#7 for curbside pick-up. Contact your hauler for details.
